Green Barriers

Because this is a mixed use area, the green barriers shown on the plans between the new project and surrounding properties are important. Can tall evergreens be considered, such as the ones recently planted between Astor Place and Beardens parking lot.? I believe they're Giant Green Abbevities. Or something similar. Trees loose their leaves and then no longer block parking lot lights.

Parking Lot Lights

Because the parking lot area is surrounded by residential can you consider a lighting plan that doesn't shine in the windows of the surrounding residential. Low lights that light the lot, not at the window height. The current lighting plan does not address the line of sight hot spots. Also perhaps use the warmer color lights rather than the cold blue lights. Also keep this in mind with the outdoor building lights.

Open Space

Could the open space not dedicated to parking be more green and less asphalt?
