AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE CREATING POSITIONS AND FIXING OR ESTABLISHING THE ANNUAL SALARIES AND HOURLY RATES COMMENCING JANUARY 1, 2025 FOR THE APPOINTED EMPLOYEES IN THE SEVERAL DIVISIONS AND DEPARTMENTS OF THE CITY OF ROCKY RIVER ON HOLD

President Furry stated this will be held until later in the meeting for the theoretical passage of Ordinance Nos. 97-24 and 98-24 which affect Ordinance No. 76-24.

ORDINANCE NO. 88-24

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE TO MAKE APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CURRENT EXPENSES OF THE CITY OF ROCKY RIVER, OHIO, DURING THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2025

3rd READING

Mr. Furry said this ordinance will need to be amended. City Council received a revised exhibit

dated 12/16/24 that he will ask to amend by substitution. The new exhibit reflects a decrease of \$1,022,183. Minor tweaks include both positive and negative, but the major one was the Sewer Rehabilitation Fund which was reduced by \$800,000 and Capital Improvements was reduced by \$200,000. Clerk of Court Comery decreased certain budgeted amounts in the Municipal Court operations, Workers Comp was reduced accordingly and the insurance premiums were reduced to reflect Ordinance Nos. 89-24, 90-24 and 91-24. Mr. Furry moved to amend by substitution, seconded by Mr. Hunt.

Mr. Furry said there was a Public Hearing on December 9<sup>th</sup> along with City Council members meeting with their Directors prior to the Finance Committee Meeting on December 6<sup>th</sup>. There have not been many questions. Mr. Furry moved for passage of Amended Ordinance No. 88-24, seconded by Mr. Hunt.

**ORDINANCE NO. 97-24** BY: THOMAS J. HUNT AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT WITH THE OHIO PATROLMEN'S BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION SERGEANTS, LIEUTENANTS AND CAPTAIN ROCKY RIVER POLICE DIVISION, AND AS FURTHER DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A" 2<sup>nd</sup> READING

Mr. Hunt said that the Mayor discussed this with City Council a few weeks ago and it was read for the first time last week. There were some discussions and noted some Scrivener's errors that were corrected. City Council received a copy of the revised agreement in their packets this week. To reiterate there are time constraints based upon the Collective Bargaining Sergeants, Lieutenants and Captain as well as the Patrolmen in Ordinance No. 98-24 from when they agreed to the new contract. Mr. Hunt moved for a rule's suspension based upon the time constraints, seconded by Mr. Furry.

Mr. Hunt said that this ordinance authorizes the Mayor to formally enter into the Collective Bargaining Agreement for the next three years, 2025, 2026 and 2027 with regard to both of the contracts, Patrolmen and Officers union. Their increases are 3%, 3.5% and 4% over the threeyear length of the contract on salaries and wages. With regard to the Sergeants, their calculation for salary increases from 13.5% in rank differential to 14.5% and the Lieutenants are above the Sergeants and are calculated at 14% and it was an increase of 1% from the last CBA which was

13%. Also of note, any of the Sergeants or Lieutenants that are assigned to the Detective Bureau, receive \$2,000 per year increase over and beyond such employee's base pay that was \$800.00. The longevity is \$150.00 for each five years of full-time service which is up from \$100.00 per year over the course of the schedule. The inequity adjustment is under Article 13 in the amount of \$3,000 for 2025. There is added language for cadet pay that was also discussed that the city will pay new hires and the police academy to receive 75% of base pay of a first-year police officer and language for lateral transfers. Mr. Hunt has not received any questions regarding this and moved this ordinance for passage, seconded by Mr. Furry.

Mr. Hunt said that for the same reasons he mentioned in regard to the prior companion Ordinance No. 97-24, time constraints require that Council move for rules suspension to get this passed and authorize the Mayor to enter into the agreement in a timely fashion. Mr. Hunt moved for a rule's suspension, seconded by Mrs. Gallagher and Mr. Furry.

Mr. Hunt said that some of the other highlights in addition to the Scribner's errors that were corrected in this CBA as well for the Patrolmen was revised language in regard to the Marine Patrol and compensation for Marine Patrol. There is also language that was clarified regarding discipline and internal investigation procedures. The Mayor added that there is language in both contracts for an opener regarding meaningful discussions about management's right to place individuals on the shifts where they are needed. With the younger police force, they would all be on the evening shift. This is an opportunity to discuss and look at what makes sense. Both parties were interested in doing this. There will be an opener if they do not arrive at a decision by September 1st. Mr. Hunt added that Chief Lichman, during the Budget Hearing last Friday, discussed the compliment of officers and doing something with the shifts. The Mayor said that was most important to the Chief during negotiations. Mr. Hunt moved for passage of Ordinance No. 98-24, seconded by Mr. Furry.

This is again creating positions and fixing or establishing the annual salaries and hourly rates commencing January 1, 2025. There has not been a lot of discussion. Mr. Furry moved for passage on Amended Ordinance No. 76-24, seconded by Mr. Sindelar.

Mr. Sindelar said this has been discussed for several weeks including the next two ordinances concerning various insurances for the city, the court and the WWTP. As he has stated numerous times, the city went with a consultant and one of the big takeaways with that is going out to market could cause higher prices. There are not many insurance companies that provide Municipal Insurance making it harder to obtain competitive rates. Mr. Sindelar feels these are competitive overall for the market purposes as the city has relatively low claims. Mr. Sindelar seeks passage on the next two ordinances also.
