ORDINANCE NO. 6-16

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR
TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN THE CUYAHOGA SOIL AND WATER
CONSERVATION DISTRICT AND THE CITY OF ROCKY RIVER,
ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT A

WHEREAS: responsibilities related to the NPDES Storm Water Phase II permit need to be executed; and

WHEREAS: cooperation between the City of Rocky River and the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District will facilitate solutions to problems encountered by the City as it plans for the development/redevelopment and conservation of the environment including water quality improvements; and

WHEREAS: the Cuyahoga Solid and Water Conservation District will provide technical assistance and expertise to the City for better conservation of soil and water resources at a cost to the City of Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000.00) for a twelve (12) month term which term shall be renewable at the City's option.

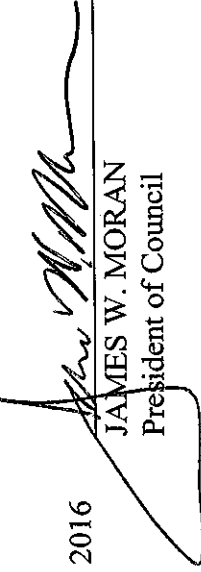
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKY RIVER, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. - That the Mayor be and she is hereby authorized to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding between the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District and the City of Rocky River for services and technical assistance related to storm water pollution prevention on construction sites disturbing one or more acres of total land, including the entire area disturbed in the larger common plan of development or sale (≥ 1 acre) as required under the NPDES General Construction Permit. Construction activities (including riparian and wetland variance requests) disturbing less than one acre and not part of a larger common plan of development or sale of total land (< 1 acre), and not covered under the NPDES General Construction Permit, will be reviewed by the District as requested by the City.

SECTION 2. - That funds for the services listed in the attached Memorandum shall not exceed Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000.00) and shall be paid from the General Fund.

SECTION 3. - That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety, and for the further reason that the agreement must be returned to the Cuyahoga Soil and Water District in a timely manner, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CUYAHOGA SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT AND THE CITY OF ROCKY RIVER, ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT A

WHEREAS: responsibilities related to the NPDES Storm Water Phase II permit need to be executed; and

WHEREAS: cooperation between the City of Rocky River and the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District will facilitate solutions to problems encountered by the City as it plans for the development/redevelopment and conservation of the environment including water quality improvements; and

WHEREAS: the Cuyahoga Solid and Water Conservation District will provide technical assistance and expertise to the City for better conservation of soil and water resources at a cost to the City of Five Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$5,500.00) for a twelve (12) month term which term shall be renewable at the City's option.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKY RIVER, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. - That the Mayor be and she is hereby authorized to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding between the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District and the City of Rocky River for services and technical assistance relative to public involvement and public education programs, storm water pollution prevention and storm water quality management.

SECTION 2. - That funds for the services listed in the attached Memorandum shall not exceed Five Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$5,500.00) and shall be paid from the General Fund.

SECTION 3. - That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety, and for the further reason that the agreement must be returned to the Cuyahoga Soil and Water District in a timely manner, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
