AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND HER DESIGNEE TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE NORTHEAST OHIO AREA WIDE COORDINATING AGENCY (NOACA), FOR TRANSPORTATION FOR LIVABLE COMMUNITIES INITIATIVE (TLCI) PLANNING, TO FUND IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE "COMMUNITY CONFLUENCE TLCI" PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Mayor, on behalf of the City of Rocky River has requested authorization from Rocky River City Council to submit an application to the Northeast Ohio Area wide Coordinating Agency (NOACA) in cooperation with the City of Lakewood and Cleveland Metroparks for funding through the Transportation for Livable Communities Initiative (TLCI) planning grant which amount will be determined, and

WHEREAS, the TLCI planning program will fund a study including integrated transportation and land use planning, promoting bike routes, and advancing the goals of NOACA's Strategic Plan for northeast Ohio, and

WHEREAS, the TLCI program is paid on a reimbursement basis, requiring the applicant to first expend funds and then request reimbursement from NOACA, and

WHEREAS, the City of Rocky River and City of Lakewood and the Metroparks agree to abide by all federal requirements as a sub-recipient of federal transportation funds, including Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Americans with Disabilities Act, and including all applicable federal procurement requirements, and

WHEREAS, the City of Rocky River agrees to complete the agreed upon scope of services or will forfeit current and future TLCI awards, and

WHEREAS, the City of Rocky River is authorized to execute a contract with Cuyahoga County Planning Commission, the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) and NOACA if awarded a TLCI planning grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKY RIVER, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor and her designee be authorized to submit this application to NOACA, acting as designated recipient of USDOT (United States Department of Transportation) funds, for the TLCI Program and to execute a contract with NOACA if selected for funding.

SECTION 2. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety, and for the further reason that timely response is necessary to participate in the grant process and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor: otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
