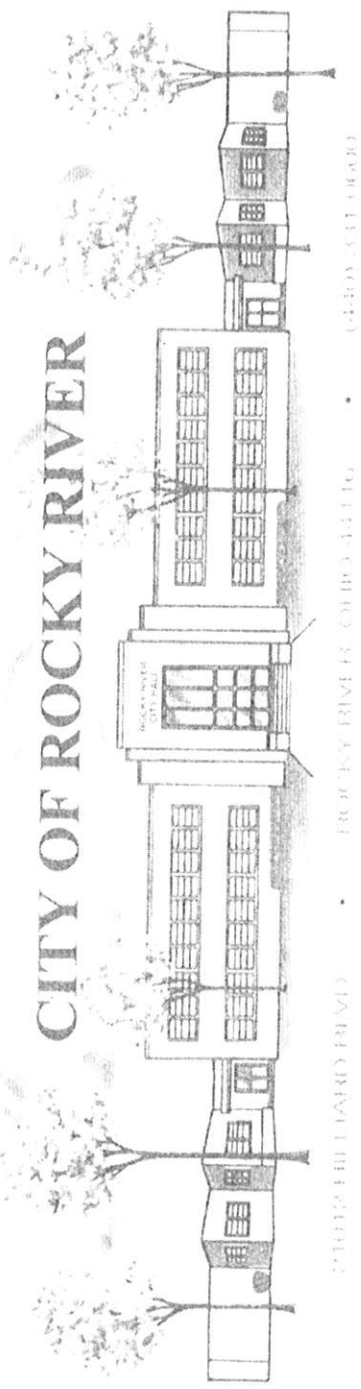

The City requested three (3) quotes for the WWTP Purchasing two (2) internal sump pumps:

2. Bergren Associates, Inc.	\$ 72,000.00	\$ 7,000.00
3. Baker and Associates	\$ 75,057.00	\$ 10,057.00

Thompson to provide the pumps which best apply to current operations and were the lowest bid. INTEROFFICE MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: City of Rocky River WWTTP
Purchasing and receipt of quotes for internal sump pumps critical to plant compliance

The project was created to replace two internal sump pumps recirculating dewatered primary bio-solids decant back through the plant. Pumps were initially planned to be a swap out replacement.

WWTP Superintendent Nicholas Barille received three quotes from different pump providers at the end of 2021. Specifications for pumps were created and sent to three vendors to allow the vendors the ability to provide a pump to meet current operating parameters. Three different pump manufactures were provided by the vendors, each vendor representing a different pump manufacture with exclusive rights to distribution. Upon receipt of the quotes, the WWTP plant consulting engineers and Superintendent evaluated each pump manufactures operating parameters to determine the best fit for the application. Following evaluation of the pump operating specifications, the Superintendent requested the footprint of the two different pump manufacturers that were found to best fit the parameters. This process extended into 2022. In addition to the footprint of each different pump the Superintendent requested an updated price quote to account for materials increased from 2021 to 2022. Henry P Thompson's pumps were found to be the best fit, and can be a direct swap for footprint, which will allow install to be completed in house and save on contractor install. Additionally, Henry P Thompson was found to be the lowest quote.

Superintendent Barille is now requesting, through Ordinance, to purchase two identical pumps from Henry P. Thompson who is the sole regional distributor of the manufactured pumps. This amount totals \$65,000 for two pumps, replacement parts, and added shipping.
